Haywood County will conduct a State Primary and County General Election on Thursday, August 6, 2020, for the following offices:

<u>State Primary:</u> US Senator, and US Representative – 8th Congressional District, TN State Senator – 26th Senate District, TN State Representative - 82nd House District, State Executive Committeeman District 26 (unexpired term)

<u>County General:</u> Public Defender – 28th Judicial District; Assessor of Property; Road Commissioner: Districts 1 & 5 (1 position), Districts 2 & 6 (1 positions) and Districts 4 & 10 (1 position); School Board Member: Districts 2 & 6 (1 position) and Districts 4 & 10 (1 position); Constable: District 1 (1 position – unexpired term) and District 3 (1 position – unexpired term).

Petitions, except for those offices included in the March 3 Primary or those that must be issued by the State Division of Elections, may be picked up from the Haywood County Election Commission Office on the lower level of the Courthouse in Brownsville during regular business hours Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. (Closed for lunch 11:30 – 12:30, unless posted otherwise).

SCHOOL BOARD CANDIDATES must provide documentation by NOON April 2, 2020 of high school graduation or GED.

CONSTABLE CANDIDATES are required to file the constable affidavit provided by the election office by NOON April 2, 2020.

The deadline to file the qualifying petition is 12 NOON on Thursday, April 2, 2020.

ACCESSIBILITY NOTICE: Disabled and/or elderly persons who believe that their polling places are inaccessible are encouraged to vote early or may vote at the Election Commission Office on Election Day. Voters who intend to vote at the Election Commission Office on Election Day must notify the commission in writing no later than July 27, 2020.
